<p>Base Camp (first weekend of two-weekend course, first two nights of weeklong course)</p>		<p>Field Experience (three nights of second weekend of two-weekend course, last three nights of weeklong course)</p>
<p>Simulate typical Scouting monthly outing style camping - “frontcountry” location, heavy camping technology, sleep/cook multiple nights in same campsite</p>	<p>Best experiential training - students fully experience LNT issues associated with typical outdoor Scouting as done in both frontcountry and backcountry recreational ecosystems</p>	
<p>Set up demonstration of typical Scouting monthly outing style camping - “frontcountry” location, heavy camping technology, do not sleep or cook in demonstration campsite</p>	<p>Good experiential training - students are exposed to LNT issues associated with typical Scouting frontcountry camping and fully experience LNT issues associated with Scouting backcountry camping</p>	<p>“Backcountry” trek - lightweight camping technology, sleep/cook in different campsites each night, camp one night in pristine area</p>
<p>No typical Scouting monthly outing style campsite is set up - students examine area of past campsites as part of discussion on LNT issues, students do not sleep or cook in a campsite</p>	<p>Good experiential training - students fully experience LNT issues associated with typical Scouting frontcountry camping during field experience and are exposed to LNT issues associated with Scouting backcountry camping</p>	<p>Primitive non-trek - simulate backcountry trail work camp with heavier camping technology, sleep/cook in same campsite each night, demo pristine area camping as a day activity</p>
